



Bicton C E Primary School and Nursery P.E. and Sport Premium Funding Planned Expenditure for 2017 - 2018 and Impact of 2016-2017

The government have recently extended the P.E. and Sport Premium funding package, for P.E. and school sport, for primary schools. **In 2016/17 our school received £8,600 and in 2017/18 we will receive £17,200 (to be confirmed.)**

The funding has been allocated to ensure that P.E. and sport are at the heart of school life to raise achievement for all young people. This will cover aspects such as the teaching of P.E. and encouraging healthy and active lifestyles and will ensure that children have access to competitive school sport.

The following areas have been identified as areas of spending for 2017/18 which will ensure that the funding raises achievement and increases the participation of children across our school:

- Continue to hire qualified coaches, to support the teaching of P.E./sport across the school and through after school clubs;
- Develop expertise of support staff and their participation in extended school sporting provision;
- Training opportunities/release time for staff in school linked to P.E. in the curriculum;
- Training for pupils off-site to develop their sport leadership skills;
- Provision of transport to a wide range of competitive sporting events off site;
- Purchase of wider range of P.E. and sporting equipment for activities in school and off site;
- And build links with schools in the wider area, as well as continuing links with our cluster schools.

Impact

The impact of these provisions will be:

- Specialists identifying and developing competitive sport will improve pupils' learning about sport;
- Opportunities to explore new sporting activities will enable children to broaden their choices for a healthy lifestyle;
- Children will be more engaged with sports and, through a wide range of competitions, will foster positive relationships with other schools and the community;
- Further development of positive attitudes towards healthy and active lifestyles;
- Increased participation in sport through inter-school competitions and extended school provision;
- Pupils will develop skills for life;
- Pupils will show increased self-esteem;
- Increased team work and resilience will enhance learning across the curriculum;
- And improved lesson outcomes and progress in P.E.

Opportunity to broaden skills in sport enhances our pupils' enjoyment of P.E. as well as building their confidence and self-esteem especially in those who are less confident. Working alongside different adults and team-working activities develops our pupils' resilience and adaptability.</p> <p>High attendance levels are evident at weekly after-school clubs over the course of the year and for different year groups/key stages.</p> <p>School doubled the number of SSCFA competitions entered in 2016-2017 which has been further increased in 2017-2018. This has increased the participation in county football for KS2 pupils allowing them to experience competitive sports with a wider audience.</p>

In 2016-2017, this increased the number of pupils attending after-school sporting clubs on a weekly basis including rounders, multi-sports, football and cross country.</p> <p>During 2016-2017, the number of pupils attending Cross Country Club each week continued to rise and helped develop positive attitudes towards an active lifestyle. This was also reflected in the number of children who competed in The Corbet's after-school cross country league during the autumn 2016 and spring 2017 terms. In 2016-2017, a large proportion of reception children took part in after-school cross country club every week and KS2 pupils performed highly in several age-groups in The Corbet cross country league.</p> <p>High participation and success in after-school rounders club and The Corbet cross country league was reflected in pupils' progression to the North Shropshire Games Level 3 events. Skills learnt in after-school archery club were utilised by Year 6 pupils who provided coaching in archery to other year groups.</p>

This ensures that all pupils achieve well in PE and they receive a broader experience in a range of sports and activities. Several children have continued with coaching outside school to further develop their skills.</p>

In 2016-2017, a wider range of events were provided at The Corbet School including a new KS2 Cross Country League and more festivals for KS1/Lower KS2 pupils. Year 6 boys were particularly successful in the cross country events.</p> <p>Pupils' higher achievement and participation in sport was reflected in the School's progression to more Level 3 events in 2016-2017 including arrows archery, tag rugby, quick sticks hockey and cross country.</p>

The equipment was also loaned to other schools in our cluster as part of our collaborative activities which enhanced the provision for a wider audience.</p> <p>Additional equipment purchased in 2016-2017 included: new sports kit to increase pupils' self-esteem as well as raise the profile of the school when participating in inter-school competitions; various items of equipment including tennis and foam balls and further investment in the Balanceability scheme. EYFS staff undertook the Balanceability training and delivered sessions to Reception pupils each week during the academic year. This is being continued in 2017-2018.</p>
		<p>In 2016-2017, we had planned to develop 'Young Leaders' in line with provision at The Corbet, to further develop and involve pupils' participation in sport. This action has been carried forward to 2017-2018.</p>
