

**Bicton C E Primary School and Nursery**  
**P.E. and Sport Premium Funding**  
**Planned Expenditure for 2019 - 2020 and Impact of 2018-2019**  
**(Next internal review April 2020)**



**In 2018/19 our school received £17,220 and in 2019/20 we expect to receive £17,110.**

The governments' PE and Sport Premium funding has been allocated to ensure that P.E. and sport are at the heart of school life to raise achievement for all young people. This will cover aspects such as the teaching of P.E. and encouraging healthy and active lifestyles and will ensure that children have access to competitive school sport. The areas identified for spending in 2019/2020 will ensure that the funding raises achievement and increases the participation of children across our school.

<b>Desired outcomes / key indicators</b>	
Opportunities will be provided that engage all pupils in regular physical activity to encourage positive attitudes towards healthy and active lifestyles.	
Pupils' leadership roles will be developed to support sport / physical activity within school, including involvement in playground provision to further increase active play.	
Broader experience of a range of sports and activities will be offered to all pupils to enable them to explore new sporting activities and choices for a healthy lifestyle.	
Profile of PE and sport will be raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement. Pupils will develop skills for life and will show increased self-esteem. Increased team work and resilience will enhance learning across the curriculum.	
Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport, to support them in teaching P.E. and sport more effectively, resulting in improved lesson outcomes and progress in P.E.	
Increased participation rates in children attending after-school sport clubs and entering competitions	
More collaboration with local schools to run competitive sporting events and build links with schools in the wider area. Children will foster positive relationships with other schools and the community

The track will also be used for children to complete the 12k of Christmas charity challenge during December.</p> <p>We aim to extend the existing playground equipment to provide a more active playground environment.</p>

The programme particularly enthused and engaged boys who were reluctant readers and encouraged some of our least active children to take part in sport.</p>	<p>The programme will be delivered to Year 3 and 4 pupils in 2019-2020. Other staff will be encouraged to observe and take part in the lessons to identify how the programme can be used in future years.</p>
