

Noun Phrases

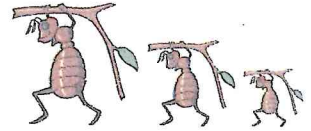
You can **add words** to **nouns** to **describe** them or to **point out** which noun you're talking about. This is called a **noun phrase**.

 **busy ants**

The writer is **describing** the ants.

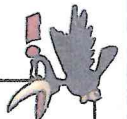
