

Noun Phrases

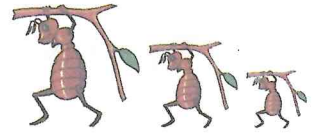
You can **add words** to **nouns** to **describe** them or to **point out** which noun you're talking about. This is called a **noun phrase**.

 **this tree**

The writer is **pointing out** which tree they're talking about.

 **busy ants**

The writer is **describing** the ants.

Put a **tick** by the sentences that start correctly.

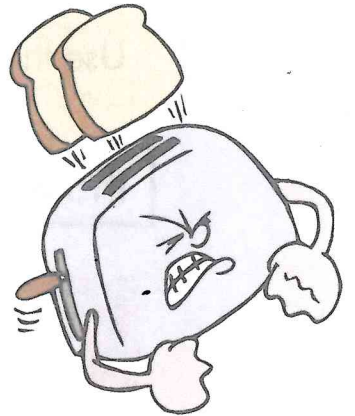

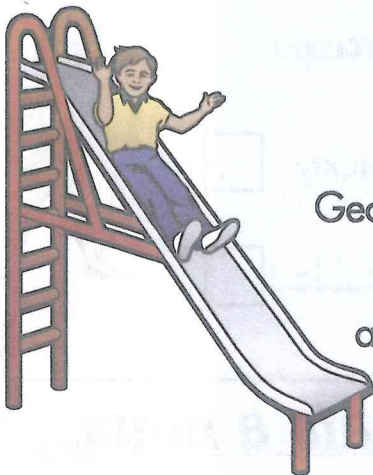


Most **other** words in a sentence should begin with **lower-case** letters.
