P.E. and Sport Premium Funding
Planned Expenditure for 2018 - 2019 and Impact of 2017-2018
(Updated May 2019)



The government have recently extended the P.E. and Sport Premium funding package, for P.E. and school sport, for primary schools. **In 2017/18 our school received £17,120 and in 2018/19 we expect to receive £17,220.**

The funding has been allocated to ensure that P.E. and sport are at the heart of school life to raise achievement for all young people. This will cover aspects such as the teaching of P.E. and encouraging healthy and active lifestyles and will ensure that children have access to competitive school sport.

The following areas have been identified as areas of spending for 2018/19 which will ensure that the funding raises achievement and increases the participation of children across our school:

- Continue to hire qualified sports coaches, to support the teaching of P.E. and sport across the school and through after school clubs;
- Further develop the expertise of support staff and their participation in extended school sporting provision;
- Continue with professional development, mentoring and training opportunities for staff to support them in teaching P.E. and sport more effectively;
- Develop pupils' leadership roles to support sport/physical activity within school;
- Provide transport to a wide range of competitive sporting events off site (including School Games events);
- Partner with local schools to run competitive sporting events and build links with schools in the wider area;
- Extend playground provision to further increase active play;
- And purchase a wider range of P.E. and sporting equipment for activities in school and off site.

Impact

The impact of these provisions will be:

- Specialists identifying and developing competitive sport will improve pupils' learning about sport;
- Opportunities to explore new sporting activities will enable children to broaden their choices for a healthy lifestyle;
- Children will be more engaged with sports and, through a wide range of competitions, will foster positive relationships with other schools and the community;
- Further development of positive attitudes towards healthy and active lifestyles;
- Increased participation in sport through inter-school competitions and extended school provision;
- Pupils will develop skills for life and will show increased self-esteem;
- Increased team work and resilience will enhance learning across the curriculum;
- And improved lesson outcomes and progress in P.E.

Opportunity to broaden skills in sport enhances our pupils' enjoyment of P.E. as well as building their confidence and self-esteem especially in those who are less confident. Working alongside different adults and team-working activities develops our pupils' resilience and adaptability.</p> <p>High attendance levels are evident at weekly after-school clubs over the course of the year and across different year groups/key stages.</p> <p>School increased the number of SSCFA competitions entered in 2017-2018, building on the successes from the previous year. This increased the participation in county football for KS2 pupils allowing them to experience competitive sports with a wider audience.</p>
£1,700 After-school sports clubs Extend use of support staff in leading and supporting after-school sport and PE activities including competitive festivals and tournaments and associated entry costs	£1,700 After-school sports clubs To continue with provision and increase participation in competitions to provide further opportunities for younger children	<p>Providing additional school staff for extended school sporting activities encourages pupil participation through providing role models and leading by example to encourage an active and healthy lifestyle. In 2017-2018, this increased the number of pupils attending after-school sporting clubs on a weekly basis including fitness, rounders, multi-sports, football, and cross country.</p> <p>During 2017-2018, the number of pupils attending Cross Country Club each week continued to rise and helped develop positive attitudes towards an active lifestyle. This was also reflected in the number of children who competed in The Corbet's after-school cross country league during the autumn 2017 and spring 2018 terms. In 2017-2018, a large proportion of KS1 children took part in after-school cross country club every week and KS2 pupils performed highly in several age-groups in The Corbet cross country league.</p> <p>High participation and success in after-school rounders club and The Corbet cross country league was reflected in pupils' progression to the North Shropshire Games Level 3 events and the finals at Sundorne Sports Village. Skills learnt in after-school archery club were utilised by Year 6 pupils who provided coaching in archery to other year groups. Year 5/6 pupils were more successful in Shropshire FA competitions and progressed to the next round in some competitions.</p>
£1,500 CPD for staff in school Employing the services of a tennis coach	£6,000 CPD for staff in school Employing a qualified sports coach to plan, deliver and model lessons which will enhance and extend the current PE provision	<p>This will increase the confidence, knowledge and skills of staff in teaching PE and sport and therefore increase pupils' enjoyment and outcomes in P.E. This will ensure that all pupils achieve well in PE and they receive a broader experience in a range of sports and activities.</p> <p>In previous years, several children have continued with coaching outside school as a result of coaching in school which has further developed their skills.</p>

In 2017-2018, this included events at Thomas Adams, The Grove School, Oswestry School and Sundorne Sports Village.
£500 The Corbet P.E. partnership Provision of School Sports Coordinator at The Corbet School	£500 The Corbet P.E. partnership Continue PE partnership links with The Corbet School	Sports festivals are timetabled in throughout the year and increased numbers of pupils have participated in competitive inter-school sports. In 2017-2018, a wider range of events were provided at The Corbet School including continuation of the KS2 Cross Country League and festivals for KS1/Lower KS2 pupils. Pupils' higher achievement and participation in sport was reflected in the School's progression to more Level 3 events in 2017-2018 including arrows archery, rounders, and cross country. Year 4 and 6 boys were particularly successful in the cross country events and progressed to the Level 3 event at Oswestry School and Year 6 also progressed to the final event at Sundorne Sports Village and achieved a top four finish.
£500 Equipment and resources Purchase of tag-rugby equipment	£1,000 Equipment/resources Audit and update equipment as necessary £3,000 Installation of Activall walls	The arrows archery equipment was used throughout the year to further develop KS2 pupil's skills and was loaned to other schools in our cluster as part of our collaborative activities; this enhanced the provision for a wider audience. Additional equipment purchased in 2017-2018 included: new tag rugby and rounders equipment. One of the balance bikes was replaced and Balanceability sessions were delivered to Reception pupils each week during the academic year. This is being continued in 2018-2019 and may also be introduced to Nursery pupils. Two Activall reaction walls will be installed during the summer term 2019. These reaction walls combine movement, action, coordination and problem solving, and provide a multi-skills cardio wall style workout. They will engage pupils of all ages and abilities, motivating children to exercise more.

We also aim to extend the existing playground equipment to provide a more active playground environment.
