# Oak Class Autumn 1 Curriculum

## English

Our English this half term will focus on two texts; 'Of Thee I Sing' by Barack Obama, and 'Star of Fear, Star of Hope' by Jo Hoestlandt. We will also be enjoying a class novel, 'Carrie's War' by Nina Bawden, and enjoying a wide range of literature and poetry through our daily guided reading lessons.

#### Topic

In History, we will be learning about the events of World War Two. We will be finding out the reasons why Britain went to war, why and how children were evacuated, what life was like on the Home Front, and the significance of VE day.

# Music
