#### Jars of Grace

We won't be able to hold any Lent lunches this year and the Bishop is not holding the usual Lent Appeal. But we think some of you will already be familiar with the idea of a 'Jar of Grace'. Through the Easter season last year we had Blessing Jars, as we offered our thanks for the particular blessings God was giving us, even in the midst of the continuing pandemic. A Jar of Grace, is a simple way of giving. While we're at home so much, instead of coming to a Lent lunch, we invite you to have your own simple – frugal! – lunch, once a week. As you do so, you put into your own Jar of Grace either real cash money (although that's in short supply at the Rectory!) or a note of how much you would like to give/pay forward at Easter. The giving is sometimes thought of as what you might have spent on the meal if you weren't making it a more frugal one, but you can put in whatever you feel is appropriate and being more generous if you can is always fine! At Easter, you decide where you would like to give the contents of your Jar of Grace. We're not going to say we'll all give to just one nominate charity, but we'd love it if as many as possible of us can take part and give to the charity of our choice. Grace received – grace given in our response of love. You may know the worship song *Freely, freely, you have received, freely, freely give*. Jars of Grace can be a way of introducing a small but helpful discipline into our Christian faith through Lent. They're also a sign and a practical way of our response to God's grace into practice. *Why not start on Ash Wednesday after participating in our online worship?* 

#### Weekly Prayer and Worship

The ministry team invites you to join us **every Wednesday through Lent** <u>from 24 April</u> to share in Midday Prayers **via Zoom.** You may remember we did this through the final days of Advent.
