**Rule 1:** when a prefix is added to a root word is does not change the spelling of the root word

**Rule 2:** Each prefix has a particular meaning and changes the meaning of the root word. Example: auto = self; biography = a recount of a person's life. auto + biography = a recount of your own life, written by you.

# Top Tips for learning a spelling:

- Test yourself how many do you know? Look at what you got right and what you got wrong. Often, people are wrong only because of one letter.
- 2. Learn your spellings using scrabble tiles. Pick out the letters to make the word. Mix them up and make the word from memory.
- 3. Look at the way colour has been used in the examples. The colour is used to pick out the rule or the syllables: Write out your spellings using this two colour method: vegetable
- 4. Find words within words: vegetable
- 5. Learn the rule. Make sure you understand it.
- 6. Make your own flashcards learn three a day.
