#### Literacy

Daily Phonics - Read Write inc - start to learn to read and write set 1 sounds. Start to blend known sounds to read simple regular words e.g. mum, dad. <u>Please wa</u> nunciation. Year 1: children will have a daily phonics, spelling and reading session



Naughty Bus Pathways to write scheme of work of the story this term is 'Naughty Bus' The children will draw and label toys, write short sentences linked to the story Year 1 children will write a recount based on the Naughty Bus adventures Our second focus book is ' The Journey

Home'. The children will sequence, refell, add labels, draw a new own journey for Hattie the Hen, adding labels and simple sentences to tell the story. Year 1 Children will write their own version of the story. <u>Communication and Language:</u>

Learn to speak with confidence during circle/carpet times Learn to listen and respond appropriately with relevant comments, questions or actions

Use appropriate story language to re-enact/re-tell simple and familiar stories

1. <u>Alive in 5:</u> Understand zero, Compare numbers to 5, understand composition of 4 and 5, be able to compare mass and capacity

2. Growing 6,7,8: Combing 2 amounts, making pairs, length and height-using the correct vocabulary to compare objects, time - Sequence events, what happened yesterday? Today? What will happen tomorrow? Identify how they have changed over time.

Building 9 and 10: Counting to 9 and 10, Comparing numbers to 10, explore 3d shapes, through construction, identify everyday items and shapes children can see in buildings, Understand, spot, talk about and make more complex patterns

In addition to these sessions the children also do a 20 minute mastering number session four times per week. The aim of these sessions is to secure firm foundations in the development of good number sense.
