Learning Objective: **words with silent letters.**

Success Criteria:

- I will know a range of ways to learn my spellings.
- I will be able to identify what is difficult to remember in one of these words and use a strategy that helps me most to help learn it.

Rule: Some words have silent letters – letters whose presence cannot be predicted from the pronunciation of the word.
Hundreds of years ago these letters were pronounced.

Top Tips for learning a spelling:

1. Test yourself – how many do you know? Look at what you got right and what you got wrong. Often, people are wrong only because of one letter.
2. Learn your spellings using scrabble tiles. Pick out the letters to make the word. Mix them up and make the word from memory.
3. Look at the way colour has been used in the examples. The colour is used to pick out the rule or the syllables: Write out your spellings using this two colour method: **vegetable**
4. Find words within words: **vegetable**
5. Learn the rule. Make sure you understand it.
6. Make your own flashcards – learn three a day.
7. Spelling strategies for this year
