#### Communication and Language

- We will play games to develop listening skills and the understanding of two- and three-part instructions encouraging children to follow them.
- Learn new, exciting vocabulary then support children using new words by rephrasing what they say to build longer sentences.
- Continue to build on comprehension and understand what is being asked to respond appropriately.
- We will focus on asking and answering 'who, what, where, why, when and how' questions.
- Continue to support interactions to develop language skills through own experiences and new experience in a themed role play area e.g. home corner, café, hairdressers, baby clinic, vets

#### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Children will continue to follow our nursery routines and rules.
- We will continue to support and manage health, hygiene and toileting.
- Encourage children to share and take turns. Talk about making good choices and the consequence of our actions.
- Children will enjoy listening to stories and rhymes during carpet time and take part in short, small group activities.
- Recognise that children may look different or live differently but have the same needs – to be loved, to be looked after, to be fed and kept safe.
- Continue to promote, encourage and praise independence.

## Physical Development

- Children will take part in PE (Wiggle Wednesday), they will develop an understanding of safety, spacial awareness, handeye coordination and moving in different ways.
- Children will take part in activities to develop fine motor skills including using a range of outdoor tools such as a trowel, a hand fork and planting seeds and through activities such as threading, cutting and dough discos.
- Children will enjoy walking, running outside and using the large play equipment such as climbing walls.
- We will begin to introduce games with teams and rules to help everyone play fairly.

#### **Mathematics**

- Continue sequencing the days of the week and months of the year through listening to and singing songs.
- Encourage children to move their fingers to show the corresponding numbers as they sing along to rhymes.
- Use 1-to-1 correspondence when counting objects.
- Continue developing recognition of up to 3, playing subitising games.
- Listen and represent sounds using fingers, copy sets of sounds with resources such as hands to clap, fingers to click.
- Explore ordinal number names.
- Continue to explore 2D shapes and introduce 3D shapes, using informal mathematical language sides, corners, straight, flat, round.
- Continue to use simple instructions to support the understanding of left and right.

# Planting and Growing



### **Understanding the World**

- Children will learn about the natural environment through Forest School (Tree-mendous Thursday).
- We will explore the natural world through a range of books.
- Jasper's Beanstalk will support learning on how plants grow; we will plant our own seeds then talk about and observe changes.
- Children will begin to understand what a plant needs to grow.
- We will explore the seasons Spring and Summer and notice changes to the environment.
- We will revisit previous topics and discuss how humans grow.

#### Literacy

- Children will continue to form more letters in their name independently and practise naming their pictures, paintings etc.
- We will model segmenting and blending CVC words orally.
- We will revisit Set 1 (RWI phonics) picture card names e.g. mountain, apple, snake, dinosaur, progressing on to teaching letter sounds.
- We will read fiction and non-fiction books. Children will join in with repeated refrains and sequence stories of our core books.
- Children will confidently describe what marks they make represent.
- Extend ideas and responses to develop enjoyment and understanding of books.

## **Expressive Arts and Design**

- Children will continue learn to recognise colours and explore what happens when they mix them.
- Experience moulding and working with clay.
- We will create our own sunflower paintings inspired by Vincent Van Gogh.
- We will provide opportunities for children to be creative using a variety of resources.
- Support pretend play and help to extend ideas.
- We will sing, dance and make music.
- Continue themed yoga sessions e.g. under the sea, children will be encouraged to develop and share their own yoga poses.
